stepONE - Become a Member

stepTWO - Discover Your Design

Dive into the details of your personality, discover your gifts, and see how your design reveals your purpose in life and your best fit in serving. Step Two takes place the second Sunday of every month.

stepTHREE - Develop Your Influence

Find out what it means to develop your influence at CLC and learn how you can strengthen your character and gifting to fulfill your potential. Step Three takes place the third Sunday of every month.

stepFOUR - Join the Team

Connect to the opportunities available at CLC to live out your purpose and serve others by using your God-given gifts. Step Four takes place the fourth Sunday of every month.



When Pastors Jerry and Chris McQuay moved to Tinley Park in 1989, they dreamed of planting a church unlike the denominational ones they had served for the previous 17 years. Their dream was to help people have a real relationship with Jesus, rather than just following the rules and regulations of religion. They named this new church, Christian Life Center, in hopes of becoming a life-giving center for the south suburbs and beyond.

Only 147 people attended the opening service at Tinley Park High School on March 25, 1990, and growth was slow for the first several years. But the life-giving teaching began to resonate with those who came, and eventually more and more people were drawn to the healing they found through the Presence of God at CLC.

Today, several thousand people attend CLC at multiple campuses in Chicagoland and the Philippines. We invite you to see for yourself how exciting church can be when the focus is simple, and people are free to seek God with passion.

1. KNOW GOD

In addition to our efforts during Sunday services, we are focused on reaching people in three key places designated by Jesus:

The primary way we reach our cities is through our Sunday services, The Hope Center, Prison Ministry, and Outreach Life Groups.

The primary way we reach our nation is by starting new churches and strengthening existing churches through the Association of Related Churches (ARC).

ARC is a church-planting organization that started with two church plants. We support ARC today as it trains, coaches, and resources hundreds of new church plants across America and abroad every year.

CLC Life Groups Model

We base our Life Groups model on the early church as described in the Bible in the book of Acts. In Acts, you can read about how small group meetings in homes helped lay the foundation for tremendous growth in the first church in Jerusalem.

Four things to know about Life Groups:

1. Our groups are "free market."

We want people to gather together based on things they enjoy and are important to them. Essentially, the things you are already doing in your life are the things that can make up your Life Group! From sports groups to lunch groups, parenting groups to student groups, Bible study groups to creative arts groups, our groups are as varied as we are. All groups fall within eight hubs:

Men • Women • Marriage and Family • Students • Freedom • Prayer • Outreach • Financial

2. There are three semesters every year.

Life flows in seasons, and we want to make it easy for you to be in the right Life Group for you in each season. This is why we have new groups that start and stop three times a year in what we refer to as "semesters."

4. MAKE A DIFFERENCE

All of us were created by God to make a difference in the world around us. God has a place for you where your unique abilities and passions can impact the lives of others. We believe your life will never make sense until you find, develop, and fulfill your purpose.

"For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do." - <u>EPHESIANS 2:10</u>

"However, I consider my life worth nothing to me, if only I may finish the race and complete the task the Lord Jesus has given me." - <u>ACTS 20:24</u>

> At CLC we don't believe there should be a great divide between the Ministers and the Congregation. Everyone has something they can do to impact the lives of others in the Kingdom of God. From our perspective, every member of CLC is a minister, every person is gifted in some area, and every task is important. Discover what you do well, and take steps to use your gifts to make a difference.



As you consider investing your heart, time, family, and finances into the life of a church, it is important for you to feel confident in church leadership. Our goal in sharing the details of CLC's government is that you will understand that our church is structured to support the values of integrity, accountability, and spiritual authority.

Our church government:

Christian Life Center seeks to be led by the Holy Spirit in all its decisions. The Senior Pastor's, Overseers, Trustees, Elders, Campus Pastors, and the congregation all have a role in the leadership of CLC.

- 1. CLC is guided by the Pastors, protected by the Trustees and strengthened by the Overseers.
- 2. The Senior Pastor's office is responsible for developing and communicating the vision and day-to-day ministry of the church; while filling the role of primary teaching pastor.
- 3. The Overseers are to protect the church by providing the Senior Pastor's objective counsel, prayer, personal accountability and if required, discipline.
- 4. The Trustees operate in an advisory capacity in providing development and oversight of budgets and in making major financial decisions and commitments.
- 5. The Elders serve the church through partnering with the Senior Pastor's in providing spiritual direction and oversight for the church.
- 6. The Campus Pastor provides each campus with pastoral care and departmental leadership at the campus level. They lead their campus' ministry leaders and provide shepherding for the people at that particular Campus.
- 7. At CLC, one of the core values is "Every member is a minister" and the congregation should individually find their place in God's plan by using their gifts to serve the body of Christ.



"Every Sunday each of you make an offering and put it in safekeeping. Be as generous as you can. When I get there you'll have it ready, and I won't have to make a special appeal." - <u>1 CORINTHIANS 16:1-4 MSG</u>

At CLC we practice tithing for the support of Christ's body, the church, as God commands. We recognize that giving 10% of our income is the Biblical standard for giving.

"Be sure to set aside a tenth of all that your fields produce each year." - <u>DEUTERONOMY 14:22–26</u>

"Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this," says the Lord Almighty, "and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that there will not be room enough to store it." - MALACHI 3:10

Giving is one of the central themes in the Bible. Jesus talked more about this subject than Heaven, Hell, or prayer. To understand what it means to be a Christ-follower, we must also understand what it means to be a giver.

Tithe \\ The tithe, or "first fruits" of our labor/income belong to God. We find this principle all through God's Word. Tithing, giving God the first 10% of our income to the local church, is the primary, practical way we acknowledge that God is first (*Proverbs 3:9–10*).

Offerings \\ An offering is giving over and above the tithe. The Bible says that by giving generously, we are able to "take hold of the life that is truly life." You aren't really living unless you are freely giving (*1 Timothy 6:18-19*).

The Gift of Giving \\ The gift of giving is a spiritual gift that God gives to some people (*Romans 12:8*). It is a Spirit-given capacity and desire to serve God by giving of your material resources, far beyond the tithe, to further the work of God.

Many people love to give to God and as they do, they want to feel confident in the organization through which they give. At CLC, we want people to understand they are giving to God **through** the church, not **to** the church. As we openly share the honesty, integrity, and spiritual values that guide the financial practices of CLC, we believe people can focus on what God is calling them to give and trust that He is leading our church to steward it well.

The giving of tithes and offerings is worship to Jesus and an expression of the relationship between the individual giver and the Lord. Funds are not "income only," they are worship and are not considered to be a business transaction but an expression of gratitude toward God.



CLC Membership Covenant:

STATEMENT OF FAITH

1. WE BELIEVE in one God, revealed as the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

2. WE BELIEVE the Holy Bible, and only the Bible, is the authoritative Word of God. It alone is the final authority for determining all doctrinal truths. In its original writing, the Bible is inspired, infallible and inerrant.

3. WE BELIEVE that man was created in the image of God, but fell into sin, and that all mankind has sinned and come short of the glory of God.

4. WE BELIEVE that our Lord Jesus Christ was begotten, not created, truly God, truly man. He was born of a virgin, lived a sinless life, performed miracles, died on the cross for mankind, and thus, atoned for our sins through His shed blood. He rose from the dead for our justification and now reigns in glory until all things are put under His feet.

5. **WE BELIEVE** that **salvation** is by grace through faith in Jesus Christ: His death, burial and resurrection. Salvation is a gift from God, not a result of our good works or any human effort.

6. WE BELIEVE in the **priesthood** of the believer - that is to say, that all born-again believers have equal access to the Lord.

7. WE BELIEVE that salvation from the penalty of sin only begins the process of redemption, and that we must yield to God's word and His Spirit in order to complete the development of Christ's character in us.

8. WE BELIEVE that all of God's people are to be **buried with Christ in the waters of baptism**, subsequent to repentance and faith in God. While freely embracing those of differing views, we believe this rite is scripturally administered "in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ".

9. WE BELIEVE that the **baptism of the Holy Spirit** is a promise to all believers, to empower the Church to preach the gospel throughout the whole earth.

10. WE BELIEVE the identity of the body of Christ on the earth is primarily perceived through the local church. While encouraging the voluntary association of local churches and recognizing the need of consensus on matters of fundamental doctrine and conduct, we strongly confess the local church to be sovereign and autonomous.

11. WE BELIEVE that the callings of apostles, prophets, evangelists, pastors, and teachers are functional within the body of Christ until the Lord's return, and that the purpose of these gifts to the church is to equip believers for the work of ministry, that the body of Christ might be edified.

12. WE BELIEVE the gifts of the Holy Spirit, as outlined in scripture, are valid and fully operative today. These gifts always operate in harmony with the Scriptures and should never be used in violation of Biblical parameters.

13. WE BELIEVE in healing of the sick as a part of the atoning work of Jesus Christ, and that healing can be received and also ministered to others by various spiritual gifts.

14. WE BELIEVE in the sacred observance of the Lord's supper, in memorial of His death, by partaking of the bread and juice, which represent the body, and blood of the Lord Jesus Christ.

15. WE BELIEVE that God Himself has established authority both in the world and in the church, and that His people are to submit themselves to these authorities. [However, should conflict arise between God's law and the civil law, we firmly declare our allegiance to God's law.]

16. WE BELIEVE that God alone is the giver of life and that practices such as abortion, euthanasia, child abuse, spousal abuse, or any other malicious violence against another human being are completely contradictory to the teachings of the Bible.

17. WE BELIEVE that Christianity is not a religion but a relationship; and that the purpose of God's Word is to instruct us as to how to have a personal relationship with Jesus Christ. Knowing God in that way will always be manifested in the keeping of His commandments and a love for our fellow man. We believe the pursuit of a relationship with God includes a time of daily prayer, periodic times of fasting, and the personal study of God's Word.

18. WE BELIEVE that God wonderfully and immutably creates each person as male or female, and that these two distinct, complementary genders together reflect the image and nature of God. We believe that God created marriage to be exclusively the union of one man and one woman, and that intimate sexual activity is to occur exclusively within that union.

19. WE BELIEVE that all human life is sacred and created by God in His image. Human life is of inestimable worth in all its dimensions, including pre-born babies, the aged, the physically or mentally challenged, and every other stage or condition from conception through natural death. We are therefore called to defend, protect, and value all human life. (Ps 139.)

20. WE BELIEVE that Biblical marriage is exclusively the legal union of one man and one woman. Therefore, the Church and its pastoral staff will not recognize, perform, or participate in any marriage between individuals of the same gender or between more than one man and one woman. We also believe that sexual activity is to take place solely within Biblical marriage. Other sexual activities, such as adultery, fornication, incest, homosexuality, and plural marriage violate the teachings of the Bible and the Church.

21. **OUR STATEMENT OF FAITH** does not exhaust the extent of our beliefs. The Bible itself, as the inspired and infallible Word of God that speaks with final authority concerning truth, morality, and the proper conduct of mankind, is the sole and final source of all that we believe. For purposes of Christian Life Center's faith, doctrine, practice, policy, and discipline, our pastoral leadership is Christian Life Center's final interpretive authority on the Bible's meaning and application. behavior or attitudes directed toward any individual are to be repudiated and are not in accord with Scripture nor the doctrines of Christian Life Center.

ABUSE POLICY

I understand that Christian Life Center is a safe place for children and vulnerable adults and that CLC complies with all Federal and State laws regarding reporting suspected child abuse. As a member of the Dream Team, I understand that suspected abuse is to be reported to the staff member who oversees the area in which I serve. I also understand the four types of abuse defined below:

•*Physical*: a physical act directed at a child or vulnerable adult that causes injury.

•*Sexual*: contact or interactions between a child and an adult, or another child, when the child is being used for sexual stimulation of the perpetrator or another person. This includes exploitation through photographs, videos, or other communication methods.

•*Emotional*: acts or omissions by the parent or other caregivers that have caused, or could cause, serious behavioral, cognitive, emotional, or mental disorders.

•*Neglect*: failure to provide for the child or vulnerable adult's basic needs. This includes adequate adult supervision, medical attention, housing, food, and clothing. Most cases of physical neglect involve inadequate adult supervision that has caused harm to the child or vulnerable adult or places them in danger of such harm.

I understand it is not my responsibility to investigate and in no instance, will I confront a parent or caregiver if abuse is suspected. As a member of the Dream Team, I agree to comply with this policy and report any suspected abuse to the staff person who oversees the area in which I serve.

HONOR CODE

As an essential part of the CLC family, you have a responsibility to develop and exhibit mature Christian behavior. This should be the basic premise of your desire to participate as a member here at CLC.

While serving the Body of Christ as a volunteer at CLC, you pledge to present a good appearance at all times. In both attire and behavior, you should strive to demonstrate Biblical standards in all situations.

As Christians, the way we present ourselves to others is of vital importance to the way others perceive Christ. Our conduct should never be an embarrassment to Christ but should exemplify the best qualities of a mature believer.

Exemplifying the highest moral commitment, CLC's members/volunteers are to maintain a disciplined life of Bible reading, prayer, and fasting. You must also refrain from such things as:

- Profanity
- Smoking or chewing tobacco
- Gambling
- Indulging in much wine or other alcoholic beverages
- Dishonest gain
- Illicit drugs
- Pornography
- Sexual immorality (*sexual activity outside of marriage*)
- All behaviors which might cause Christ to grieve and others to stumble

By providing an example in speech and action, we encourage others to grow in Christ and become members/volunteers themselves. This is a way of life measured by the heart and commitment of each member in the CLC family. We should regard it as an essential part of our development, not as an imposition or restriction.
